From the Pastor's Desk

Every four years, I enjoy watching the Olympics. The competitions this week gave me a great visual into the second reading from the Letter to the Hebrews in how to be victorious in the "race that lies before us" to the finish line of eternal life. First, when watching the swimming competitions I noticed that everything they wear from their swim caps to their swim suits are streamlined and they even shave all their body hair so there will be nothing to slow them down. The letter to the Hebrews tells us that in this 'race' of faith we also need to "... rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us" in order to streamline our discipleship.

The second insight was from watching gymnastics. Before and during the routines for each apparatus, the intense focus of the gymnast is apparent. The crowd and the surrounding activities do not even register on their face; they are completely focused on what lies before them. In our discipleship, we must "keep[...] our eyes fixed on Jesus". By ridding ourselves of our burdens and sins, while keeping our souls focused on Christ, we will truly find ourselves victorious.


