A Pro-Life Eucharistic Procession will take place **today, Sunday, January 21**. All parishioners and families are invited to participate in this public expression of our faith and belief in the dignity of all life and also to give praise and adoration to our Lord, the Author of all life.

- ♦ **The procession** begins at Welhausen Park at 2:00 p.m. to process to church while praying the Rosary.
- ♦ **A bus** will be provided to take participants from church parking lot to park at around 1:30 p.m.
- ♦ **All parish organizations** are urged to participate while carrying their banners.
- ♦ **All altar servers** are asked to join the procession, vested in their albs.
- ♦ **Those unable to walk** in procession are invited to take part by spending time praying in church until the procession arrives for the closing prayers and Benediction.



"When God saw by their actions how they turned from their evil way, he repented of the evil that he had threatened to do to them; he did not carry it out."
Jonah 3:10

As we make our way through this yearly litany of Pro-Life activities, it is very easy for us to lose perspective of what exactly we are doing, to go through the motions. The context is quite stark: since January 22, 1973, over 60 million children have been legally killed in our nation. That's ten times the death toll of the Holocaust, and about equal to the total death toll of World War II. More than the population of Shiner is killed daily in this country.

The scope of this horror is impossible for us to grasp properly, both because of the large numbers, and because abortion is a deed done in secret. Our bishops encourage us to pray daily for an end to abortion, and to petition our civic leaders to support life. January 22 (Tomorrow) is the anniversary of Roe v Wade, and is a national day of prayer for the legal protection of unborn children. I ask you to pray for the unborn children whose lives are in danger, and for their mothers.

As horrific and blinding as abortion is, we must not forget to address the quiet, underlying causes of abortion. No mother seeks abortion from a place of freedom, but shame, fear, or desperation. If we truly seek an end to abortion, we must support mothers in crisis. We must always love first, without condemnation, as Christ loves them. Pray for these mothers in crisis, support them when they arise among your families and friends, and support Project Gabriel to provide assistance to these mothers and their children.

Others are encouraged to participate by praying daily offering **an Our Father, 3 Hail Marys, and Glory Be** for the intentions specified in the remaining days of the novena as follows: **Jan. 20**, For victims and survivors of human trafficking; **Jan. 21**, May all people embrace the truth that every life is a good and perfect gift, and is worth living; **Jan. 22**, May each person suffering from the loss of a child through abortion find hope and healing in Christ; **Jan. 23**, May those near the end of their lives receive medical care that respects their dignity and protects their lives; **Jan. 24**, May those who long for a child of their own be filled with trust in God's loving plan; **Jan. 25**, For an end to the use of the death penalty in our country; **Jan. 26**, For God's peace to fill the hearts of all who travel upon the path of adoption.
